- The Rounders Festival at Freman involved over 360 pupils from years 3 - 6 and 50 Freman leaders
- The Summer Schoolympics hosted by Meridian had 309 competitors and over 60 leaders from the middle and upper schools

In addition there was also an athletics festival for year 4s at Greneway School and the Annual Year 3 & 4 Cricket Festival at Cockenach with 8 teams batting and bowling for glory - a beautiful afternoon in a beautiful setting.

The new Sport England initiative of Satellite Clubs made great use of the facilities at Meridian School with Reed C C running a cricket club and Royston H C organising a hockey club.
